

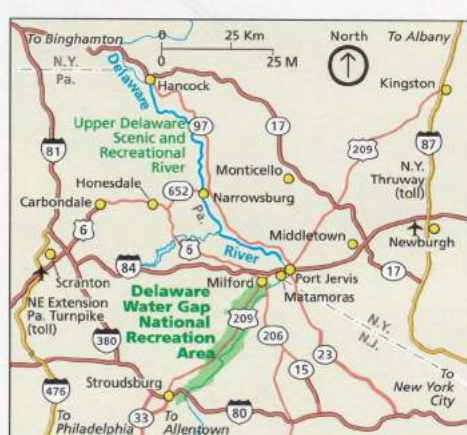
Delaware Water Gap

Getting to the Park Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area is easily reached from the New York and Philadelphia metropolitan areas and from Allentown, Bethlehem, and Scranton, Pennsylvania. Food, lodging, gasoline, and medical services are available in the towns near the park.

Safety and Laws • Always wear a life preserver when boating or canoeing. Pennsylvania law requires children age 12 and under to

wear life preservers while in a canoe, kayak, or a boat less than 20 feet long. • Hunting is permitted in some parts of the park; check the areas and dates of hunting seasons with the park staff. • Rock and ice climbers should always let a friend know when and where they plan to climb. Never climb alone. • Use of metal detectors in the park is prohibited. • Emergencies: call 800-543-HAWK (800-543-4295).
